While Holtes starts to practice Bach's music on the organ, Josse occupies a growing part of his thoughts and feelings. Then Josse graduates and decides to leave their

hometown in order to study music at university. In the few days that remain before she is to leave, they go on a journey following in Bach's footsteps. But Holtes does not dare to confess his feelings to Josse. After Josse's departure Holtes practices one of Bach's preludes as Josse had told him to, yet he cannot fill the empty space her absence has left in his life. When Josse comes home for Christmas she has changed, moving away from Bach and from Holtes. "Prelude for Josse" is a beautiful and poetic novel about the magic of first love, about approaching and missing each other. As finely crafted as a musical masterpiece, the book gently and poetically captures the transience of the moment.

Snorre Björkson, born in 1968 in the north of Germany, plays several musical instruments. He has written poetry and radio plays, performs as a cabaret artist and in theatre.

Armin Mueller-Stahl: Chairoplane

The border crossings from life to death, from reality to dream, from rationality to magic provide the recurring motif in these short stories. A psychotherapist learns from one of her patients that her lover died the day before, while performing a spectacular stunt. A priest is afflicted with a strange curse: all the ailments of those seeking his comfort seem to be passed on to him. Two gravediggers engage in conjectures about the lives of those they bury in the pouring rain. A

magician arranges the feigned death of three Jews and thus helps them to escape from the Nazis. In intensive snapshots - dark, funny and at times enigmatic - Armin Mueller-Stahl superbly outlines dense atmospheres and complex characters.

Born in 1930, Armin Mueller-Stahl was a noted film actor in the GDR. After his expulsion in 1977, he moved to the west in 1980 and recouped his film stardom in productions by Fassbinder and Agnieszka Holland. He gained international recognition in Costa-Gavra's »The Music Box« (1989), Barry Levinson's »Avalon« (1990) and, above all, for his portrayal of pianist David Helfgott's domineering father in Scott Hicks' »Shine« for which he received a Best Supporting Actor Oscar nomination. He has written several best-selling novels.



Hans Fallada a Twentieth Century German Classic of Universal Appeal

Hans Fallada (1893-1947) achieved world renown for his sociocritical documentary novels dealing with Germany in the post-World War I era. His contemporaries saw him as one of the leaders of the »Neue Sachlichkeit«, the new German literary movement towards realism and objectivity. Fallada's greatest success came with »Kleiner Mann, was nun?« a brilli-

ant depiction of the petit-bourgeoisie caught in the Great Depression. He began writing this novel in 1931, when unemployment was rising to a peak of forty per cent in Germany and the National Socialists had become a serious threat. When the book was published in 1932 it ran through 45 printings in its first year of publication. One year later the book had become a runaway bestseller. »Kleiner Mann, was nun?« was translated into more than twenty languages. It was filmed twice within two years of its appearance, once in Germany and once in the USA by Universal Pictures.

Unlike most other prominent German authors who went into exile with the rise of Hitler, Hans Fallada remained in Germany. He did not openly criticize the Nazi government but rather retreated into "internal exile". Despite his early affinities with socialism, he considered himself apolitical and tried to live an isolated life in the countryside where he imagined himself far removed from any direct connection to politics and government interference. His withdrawal not only earned him harsh criticism, but it virtually killed off the fame he had established as a novelist in the outside world before the war. However, although he fell into silence during the war, he had never sympathized with the Nazis, as the novels "Der Trinker", written during a stay in a mental hospital in 1944, or "Jeder stirbt für sich allein" reveal.

Tragically, Fallada's private life had consistently been overshadowed by nervous breakdowns and drug addiction. During his last years he had been in and out of sanatoriums. While preparing the publication of »Jeder stirbt für sich allein« in 1947, Fallada died of heart failure.

Hans Fallada's audience has been wide and substantial, encompassing generations of fans for his novels and children's books. The most recent enormous success of Hans Fallada's work in France shows that his work not only still merits but is regaining international attention.

Anna and Otto Quangel are an elderly couple during the time of the Nazi rule of Germany. When their son is killed while fighting to occupy France, they are shocked out of their complacency and begin sending postcards and pamphlets all over Berlin with the inscription "The Führer has murdered my son."

This earns them the ire of the Gestapo and a death sentence. With the help of friends, this brave couple manages to meet their deaths with a rare dignity. Fallada demonstrates the powerlessness of the individual in the face of state authority but also stresses the importance of individual courage to stand by one's beliefs and values. 

His elixir consists of the illustrious company he keeps with interesting and ingenious contemporaries such as Thomas Mann, Sigmund Freud and August Strindberg, among many others. Meticulously, he records his encounters in his diary, which reads like a who's who of the intellectual upper crust of his time.
